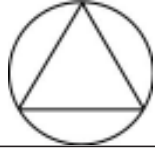

## Founder's Day

As we approach June 10th, our 74th Anniversary as a fellowship; let us look at the miracles that our Higher Power brought about to establish this fellowship and program that has saved so many lives over this period. The events that brought this fellowship into being are fascinating.

When the Big Book was written in 1934, it was designed on the basis of problem solving. The three main elements of problem solving are: (1) Defining the problem; (2) Defining the solution; and (3) Finding the process to get from the problem to the solution. How were these three elements brought together to provide the start to Alcoholics Anonymous?

### **The Problem:**

The problem was given to Bill Wilson in 1934 by Dr. Silkworth when he explained to Bill that it was a disease of two parts. First an allergy of the body where craving developed when alcohol was consumed, and second that an obsession of the mind existed that made it appear alright to take the first drink which then triggered the allergy and brought on the spree of drinking. This mental obsession is the insanity talked about in the second step.

### **The Solution:**

The solution was given to Roland Hazard in the early 1930s by Dr. Carl Jung as, a rare Spiritual or Religious Experience that brings about, as it is defined in Appendix 2 of the Big Book, "...the personality change sufficient to bring about recovery from alcoholism". Roland carried this to Frank Buckman and the Oxford groups.

### **The Program of Recovery:**

The Oxford Groups, in their quest for perfect Christian zeal and behavior, developed a six step process that was found to help alcoholics achieve some level of sobriety. These six steps were:

- (1) Complete deflation
- (2) Dependence and guidance from a Higher Power
- (3) Moral Inventory
- (4) Confession
- (5) Restitution
- (6) Continued work with-other alcoholics

As the result of Roland working with Ebby Thatcher and Ebby coming to Bill in his kitchen, these three elements were brought together with Bill Wilson as the catalyst. By receiving all three of these elements, he was able to stay sober, attending Oxford Group meetings and working with other alcoholics he drug in off the street. Although none of the others stayed sober, Bill did as his wife Lois pointed out to him.

Bill, concerned that he was not being effective working with others, consulted Dr. Silkworth prior to going to Akron on the famous business trip. Dr. Silkworth told Bill that he had been preaching to these others, trying to convert them to the solution without ever telling them about the problem. He reminded Bill about their talks and suggested that Bill tell these others what he (Dr. Silkworth) had told Bill.

When Bill went to Akron and met with Dr. Bob, his approach was totally different, giving Dr. Bob the problem. We have to realize that Dr. Bob had been attending the Oxford Group meetings for longer than Bill and had not been able to stay sober. From this we can conclude that the third piece of the puzzle, the definition of the problem, given by Bill to Dr. Bob had a significant effect on him and allowed him to find permanent sobriety.

The miracles that we can see here are: (1) The Higher Power used Bill as the catalyst for all the pieces necessary to achieve sobriety and gave him the immediate spiritual experience. (2) That Dr. Bob, a medical person would accept the medical definition of the problem from a non-medical person, Bill. (3) That with Dr. Bob's slow educational variety of spiritual experience we have both ends of the spectrum. It took Dr. Bob several years to loose the craving for alcohol. (4) That Dr. Bob's "keep it Simple" philosophy tempered many possible actions that could have destroyed the fellowship.

Let us be grateful on this Anniversary of Dr. Bob's last drink for the guiding power that has given so many sobriety.

## Moving Away

The last bits of my apartment were strewn haphazardly around the backseat of my car, and my carefully caged cats were beginning to seriously damage my serenity. Hours in a car with no air conditioning, surrounded by the smell of rubber galoshes baking against the rear window, were going to drive me insane. I was moving to a place I had never heard of before. I was moving away from all my friends in the program. There would be no familiar face on the Starbucks patio. I was nervous. I was scared. I had no sponsor. I had no home group. There wasn't a coffee commitment waiting for me before the Tuesday Newcomers meeting. My life was

in boxes and I was putting them in my higher power's hands.

Today, I wake up and I can't believe I was ever anxious. AA gives me something I can't adequately express. I have a family that understands me wherever I go. I showed up. I suited up. AA gathered me up and plopped me right in the middle. AA gave me common ground. It gave me people to talk to on my first day. It allowed me to put away my awkward nervousness. It turns out all I had to do was jump. The AA community and my higher power caught me.

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## The Easier, Softer Way

When I first became serious about getting sober, I read the 12 Steps and thought 'this will be a snap.' By that time, I had completely accepted the First Step and its implications.

But of course, there were a few stumbling blocks.

Although I truly believed that 12 steps shouldn't take any longer than 12 weeks, I set to work on the remaining 11 immediately. I first ran into a bit of a block because I did not believe there was a GOD of any kind. After all, if there was, how could all the awful stuff continue to happen in the world, right? Therefore, I felt completely justified in just skipping the Second and Third Steps.

That, however, created another problem: there stood the Fourth and Fifth Steps. Oh boy, this might be a little tough, I thought. But I managed to write a 'pretend' 4th Step. By that, I mean that the things I wrote down really were things I'd done wrong and anyone would agree with that, but I didn't feel anything about those things. No guilt, remorse or sadness. Obviously, the 5th Step was just as easy because it didn't mean a thing to me either. At the end of that, I waited to feel better. After all, both the Big Book and 12 and 12 said I would. I waited months and didn't feel a bit better, nor did the desire to drink leave. Day after day, my knuckles were the color of flour because I was holding on so hard. But when anyone asked if I'd done a 4th and 5th Step I replied that I had.

Nobody thought to ask about the 2nd and/or 3rd. I crept along wanting a drink for nearly 2 years, before my sponsor broached the subject. She asked if I'd tried "turning it over to God." I said what the h.... good would that do?

I think that at that point she realized that I had NO conscious with any Higher Power whatsoever. When she asked, I answered honestly and said I didn't believe that any 'made up super hero' would help.

God bless my sponsor, I was not an easy case. But she stuck with me. She again broached the "God subject" about a month later when I was AGAIN in crisis. She said simply why not try turning it over to God, I had nothing to lose, after all. In my sick mind, I chuckled and said, "yeah, and I'll prove to YOU it doesn't make a bit of difference."

Well, believe it or not, I began using the Third Step on a relatively regular basis and it began to work. Again, I couldn't see that at the time. I actually started feeling a little better and didn't want to drink as often. Step Two was an entirely different topic, which I won't address right now.

With the onset of feeling better and correlating that with use of Step Three, I realized that I hadn't done anything resembling a 'search and fearless moral inventory.' And thus began my real journey into recovery.

My journey has never been easy, probably because I fought and argued with just about everything that was suggested. But here I am today—still alive, still sober, still working on a 12 Step journey that probably will never end. The biggest difference is that most of the time today: I don't think about drinking, I feel good emotionally and spiritually and most of all about myself.

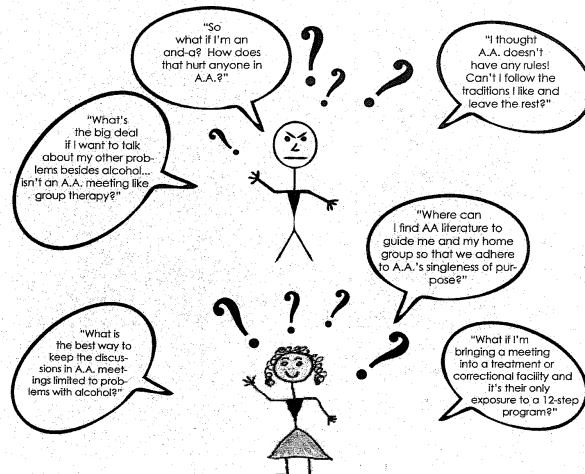
